

South Africa: Visiting the Tip of the World

It is a one-and-only experience as the tourists stand at the very tip of the continent. It is also possible to watch whales from there. If tourists are ready to travel more, an ideal place to visit is the Robben Island, a UNESCO world heritage site, accessible by ferry.

Many tourists are attracted by opportunities to see the wildlife. South Africa's Kruger National Park is one of the largest game reserves in South Africa. Nowadays it stretches across South Africa's national borders to Mozambique and Zimbabwe. Exotic animals like buffalo, elephant, leopard, lion or rhino and many others can be seen there. There are also various locations for bird-watching.

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
