

Caribbean Spa Industry Needs Improvements

"Why leave Europe and come to the Caribbean for a European experience?" said Caribbean Spa and Wellness Association board member Steve Andrews. "Most people in the world have a fantasy about the Caribbean but when they come to a wellness spa they don't see a lot of the Caribbean. Our biggest challenge is that we need to fully embrace our indigenous culture and people of the Caribbean."

According to Mr. Andrews, the Caribbean spa industry needs to use its natural resources that make its wellness services unique. The Caribbean has a lot to offer as there are mountains, hot springs, rivers, waterfalls, animal and marine life as well as traditional herbal medicines. The regional spa and wellness industry also needs standardization that along with other measure could create the "Caribbean brand". If everything that was proposed goes well, the region could become the wellness spa of the world.

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
