

# Lord Digby Jones Headlines WTM's New Business Day

Lord Jones was Director-General of British business organisation Confederation of British Industry between 2000 and 2006. On leaving the CBI Lord Jones took up the unpaid role of UK Skills Envoy before become Lord Jones of Birmingham when accepting the role of Minister of State for UK Trade & Investment.
