Portugal, the Best Country in the World to Telecommute

Portugal leads the world rankings thanks to its high scores in all the categories analyzed, including great weather, plenty of places to go out, low crime rates and a relatively low cost of living.

Portugal also offers a visa for digital nomads and the local population has a high level of English which is very attractive to travelers.

Spain, Named the Second-best Country in the World

Spain occupies second place in the ranking thanks to its large number of bars and restaurants per capita, combined with high-speed internet service, numerous coworking spaces, and visas for freelance workers. Other aspects for which Spain earns points in this ranking are its lively nightlife and the fact that it is an "LGBTQ+ friendly" country.
