TOP 10 PLACES TO VISIT IN ATLANTIC CITY, NJ



Although the city began as a sleepy fishing community, at the end of the 1800s, it had developed into the top oceanfront vacation spot in the USA. It has also long been a popular destination for water-based sports including sailing, swimming, and surfing. Today we are going to see the places you should definitely visit in Atlantic City.

Boardwalk

The <u>Boardwalk</u> in Atlantic City is the most well-known and well-liked attraction, and it is brimming with exciting activities to do. The original 4-mile-long length of planks that was constructed in 1870, the majority of which withstood Hurricane Sandy in 2012, is lined with nearly everything worth seeing in the city.

Golden Nugget

The premium casino-hotel Golden Nugget in Atlantic City has 727 rooms and is roughly a 10-minute drive from the boardwalk. It offers all the features you would anticipate from a casino of this scale, including ten restaurants, a stylish outdoor pool, clean, spacious guest rooms with flat-screen TVs, and two entertainment venues. **It's a good choice if you want a casino complex with everything under one roof**. They also have an excellent online casino. This is the perfect time to try yourself at gaming as the industry of the state is bustling, it jumped up by 15% from May 2021 to May 2022.

The Steel Pier

The Steel Pier is the equivalent of Coney Island in Atlantic City. **This lovely antique amusement pier, constructed in 1898, was and still is one of the most popular tourist destinations in the country**. People of all ages can enjoy a range of rides, from teacups and miniature trains for young children to roller coasters and swing carousels for older children and adults.

Ocean City

Ocean City, which is only eleven miles south of Atlantic City, is a very well-liked destination for families. In addition to having some of the nicest beaches on the coast of the Atlantic, this coastal resort has been free of alcohol since it was founded by Christian pastors in 1879.

Lucy the Elephant

Today, the elephant stands in Josephine Harron Park and was included in the National Park Registry of Historical Landmarks after being saved from near oblivion in the 1960s. The "howdah," a little cabin on the back with stunning panoramic vistas, is one of the highlights of a visit to the oldest surviving unique construction in the US.

Jim Whelan Boardwalk Hall

It opened its doors in 1929 and is still the most well-liked location for concerts and events in the city. It is renowned for hosting the finals of Miss America. The biggest musical instrument on Earth, a pipe organ with 33,000 pipes, 1,000 keys, and 8 chambers is also housed in this historic location.

Borgata Hotel Casino & Spa

With a casino floor that is 161,000 square feet in size, the enormous Borgata Hotel Casino & Spa is one of the best <u>gambling venues</u> in the city. Once you've gotten your fill of the 4,100 slot machines and 200 table games, visit Bobby Flay Steak, swim in the indoor pool, work out in the large fitness facility, or relax in the spa. **The 2,000-room Borgata Hotel Casino & Spa has a prime site on the outskirts of Atlantic City, overlooking the harbor at Renaissance Pointe**.

Atlantic City Historical Museum

The Atlantic City Historical Museum, which is housed at Jim Whelan Boardwalk Hall, tells the story of how the city evolved from a sleepy fishing community to one of the busiest vacation spots in the US.

Historic Gardner's Basin

It is a waterfront park and maritime hamlet with several unique attractions that make it a noteworthy destination for tourists. Original maritime displays like the Steel Pier Diving Bell, which lowered visitors to the seafloor, are among the highlights you can find here.

Atlantic City Art Center

The Jim Whelan Boardwalk Hall now houses the <u>Atlantic City Art Center</u>, which was formerly the first gallery in the nation to be built on a municipal pier. **Despite moving, the gallery continues to be a well-liked destination and is renowned for its displays of artwork by both international and local artists**. The museum offers exhibits that include paintings, sculpture, and photography among other mediums as a break from the excess and commercialism of the metropolis.
