Daily tours of the Hoover Dam Power Plant are available throughout the year, and you can walk out onto the dam to experience stunning views from the edge as you look out over Lake Mead and the Mojave Desert. Taking a helicopter tour is another memorable way to experience this manmade wonder.

Great Basin National Park

If you want to experience the colors of fall, Great Basin National Park is one of the best places in Nevada to do so. The Park's mountains, covered with yellow, red, and gold aspen trees, are a sight to behold. As you walk along the trails throughout the Park, you can pick pine nuts and enjoy the cool air. While you're there, you'll also want to explore the Lehman Caves with a ranger-led tour. If you're

short on time, you can drive the 12-mile Wheeler Peak Scenic Drive to enjoy the autumnal foliage.

Valley of Fire State Park

The Park is located near the Hoover Dam and Lake Mead, making it an easy day trip from Las Vegas. The striking rock formations and sweeping views are some of the most dynamic landscapes in Nevada. You can take a scenic drive through the Park to enjoy awe-inspiring views of the area or hike one of its many trails, which include rock walls with petroglyphs and slot canyons. Several campgrounds are available at the Park, so If you have extra time, you may want to consider spending the night.
