Up to 36,000 euro fine for music on the beach

In Portugal, a new law is set to ban sound equipment and noise-generating activities that may cause a disturbance. The AMN has stated that anyone caught playing music in a group may face a fine ranging from 2,000 to 36,000 euro.

According to the AMN, individuals may face penalties ranging from 200 to 4000 euro for excessive noise. The authorities may also seize related items such as loudspeakers. Tourists and locals are urged to report any noise disturbances on the beach. However, "too loud" has not yet been established.

The AMN has a solid commitment to keeping the coasts of Portugal quiet. The high penalties are meant to serve as a deterrent and encourage individuals to be more considerate of others.
